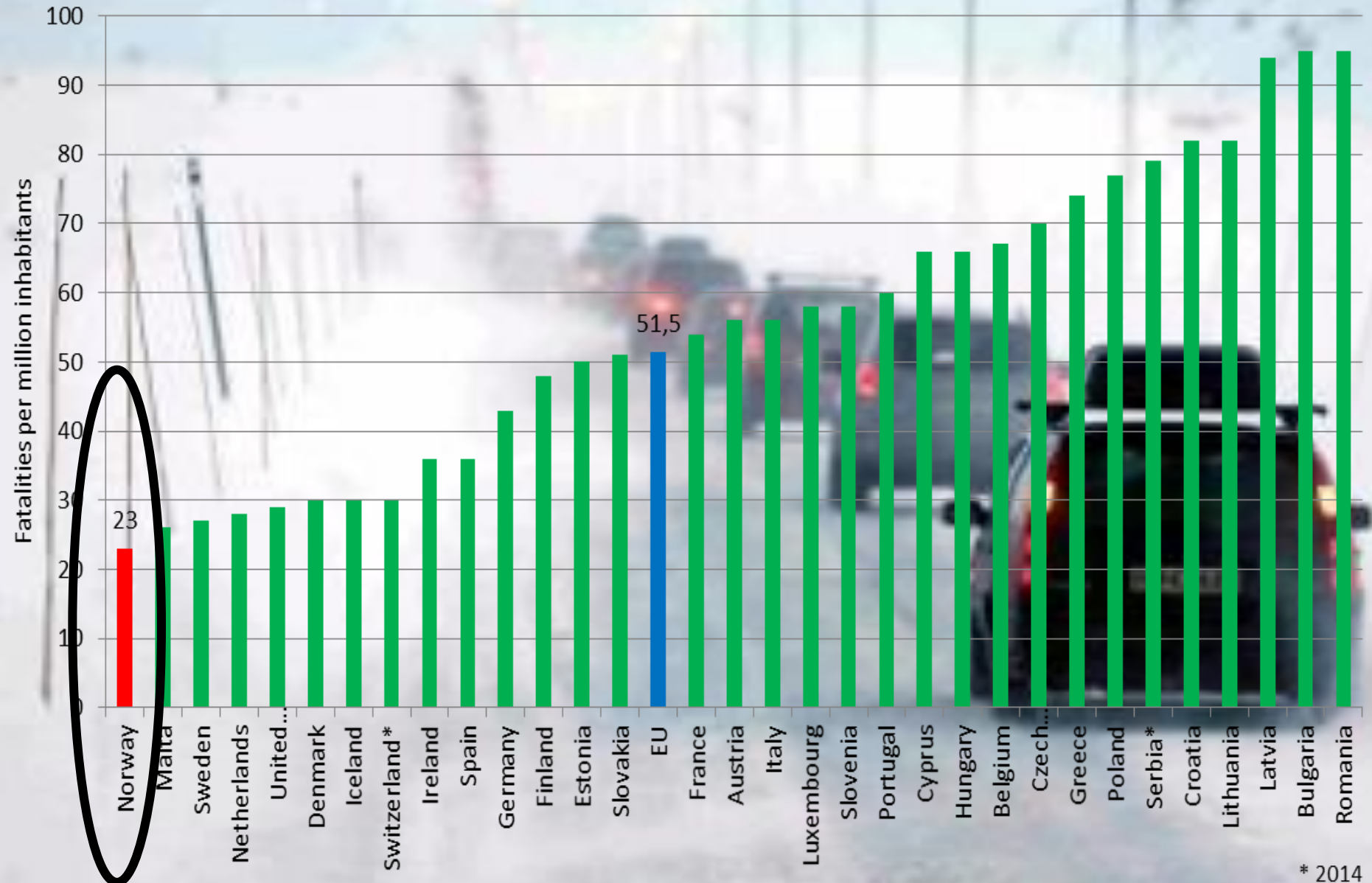

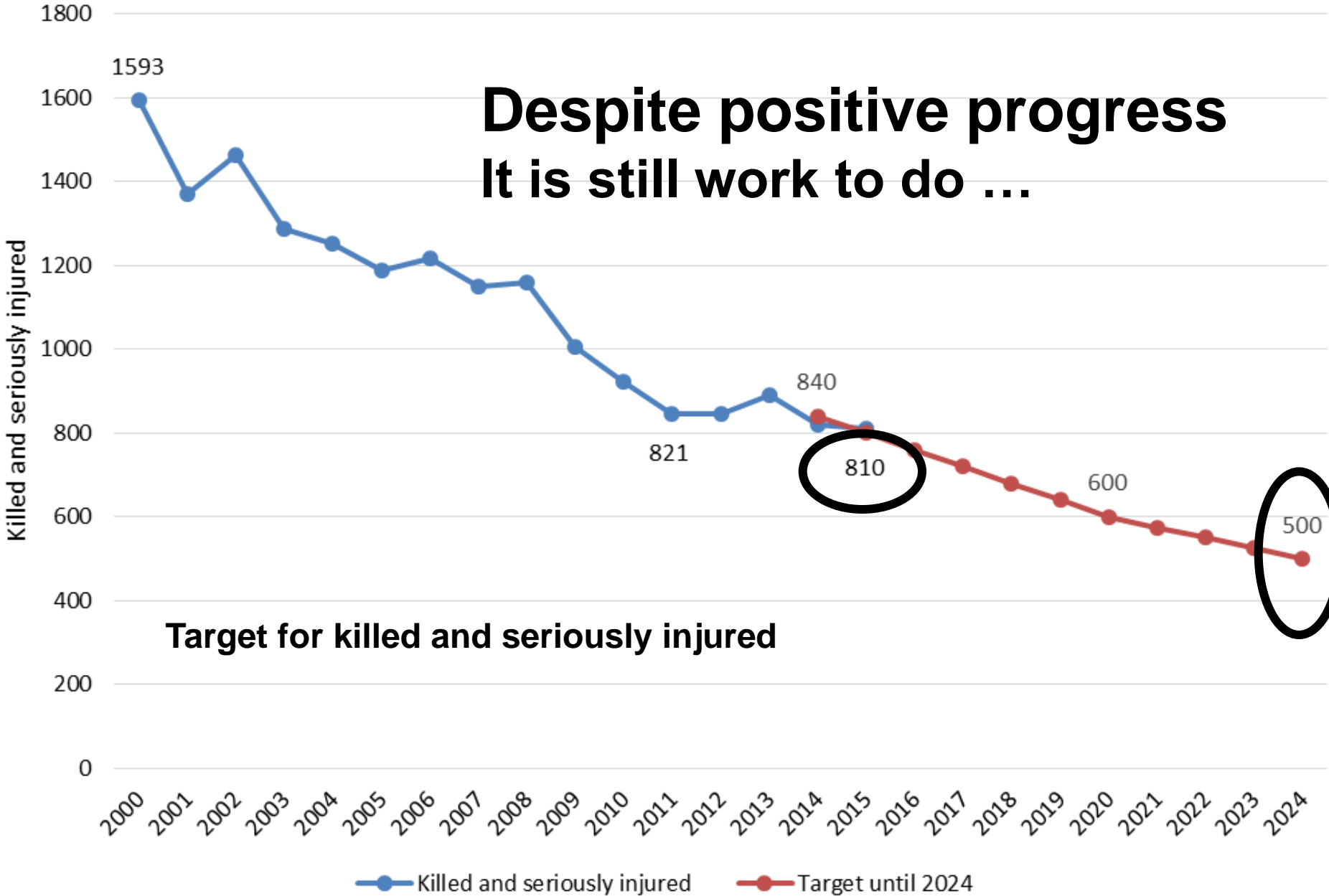



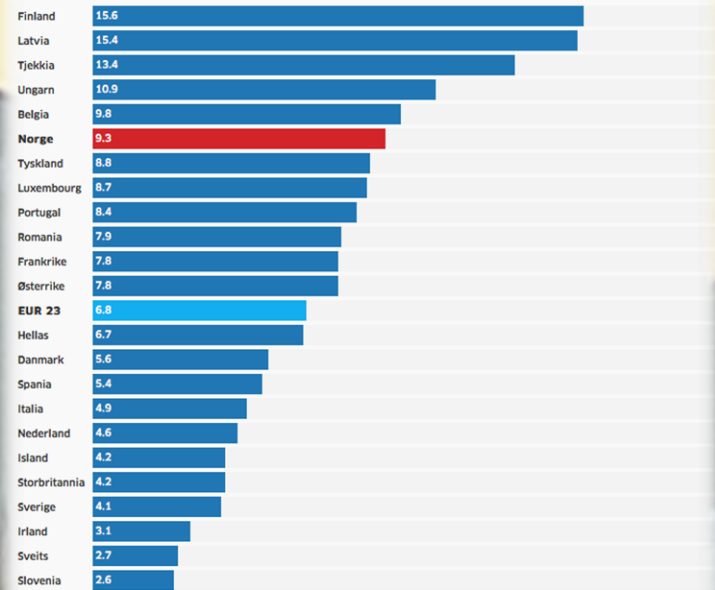

Challenges and main-targets

- ✓ *Speeding offences (inappropriate speed - both exceeding the speed limit and driving within the limit, but also too fast for the conditions)*
- ✓ *Drink and drug-driving offence*
- ✓ *Driver Inattention*
- ✓ *Not wearing a seat belt (mandatory front and rear – also for police officers ...)*
- ✓ *Criminals' use of roads*

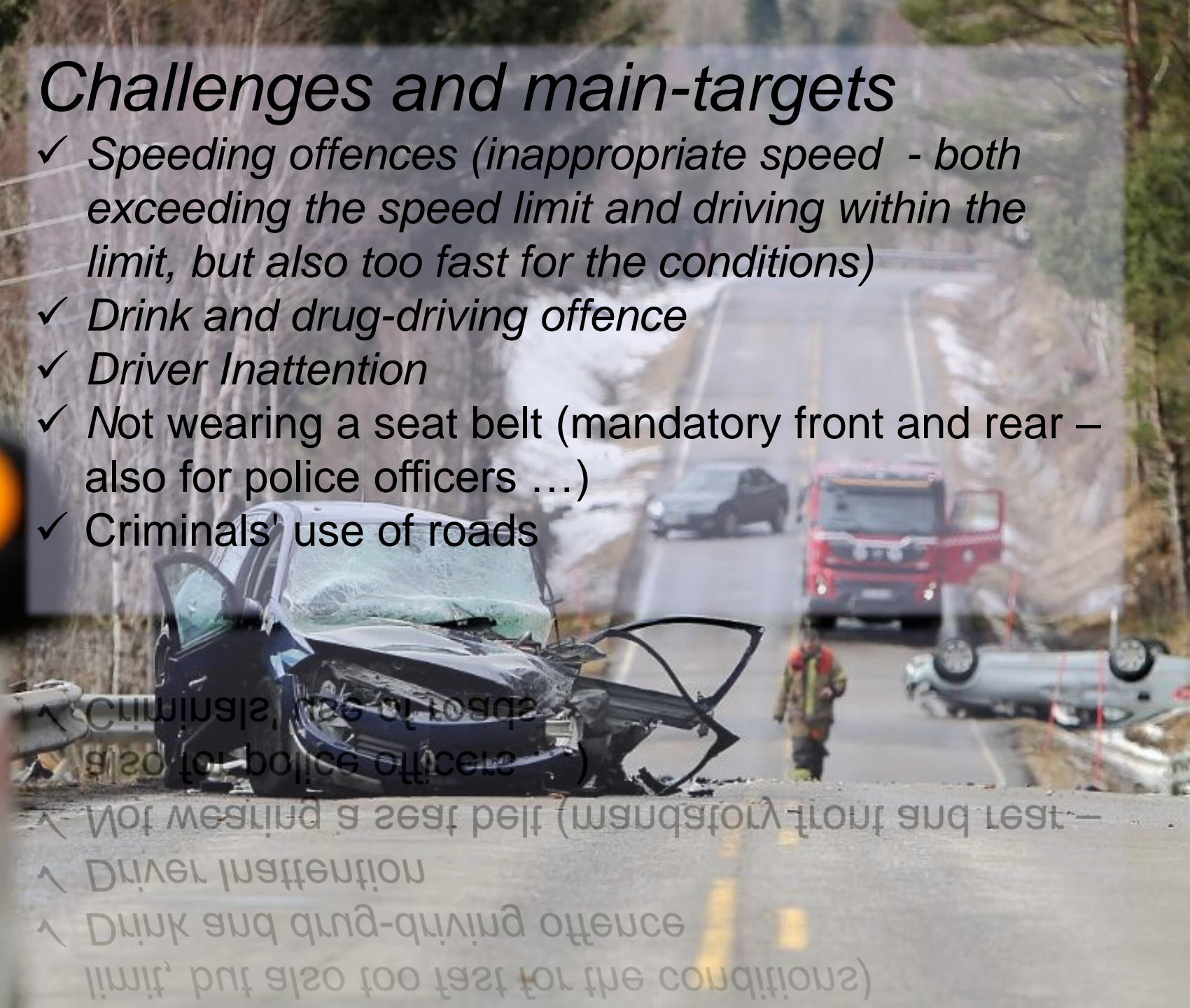

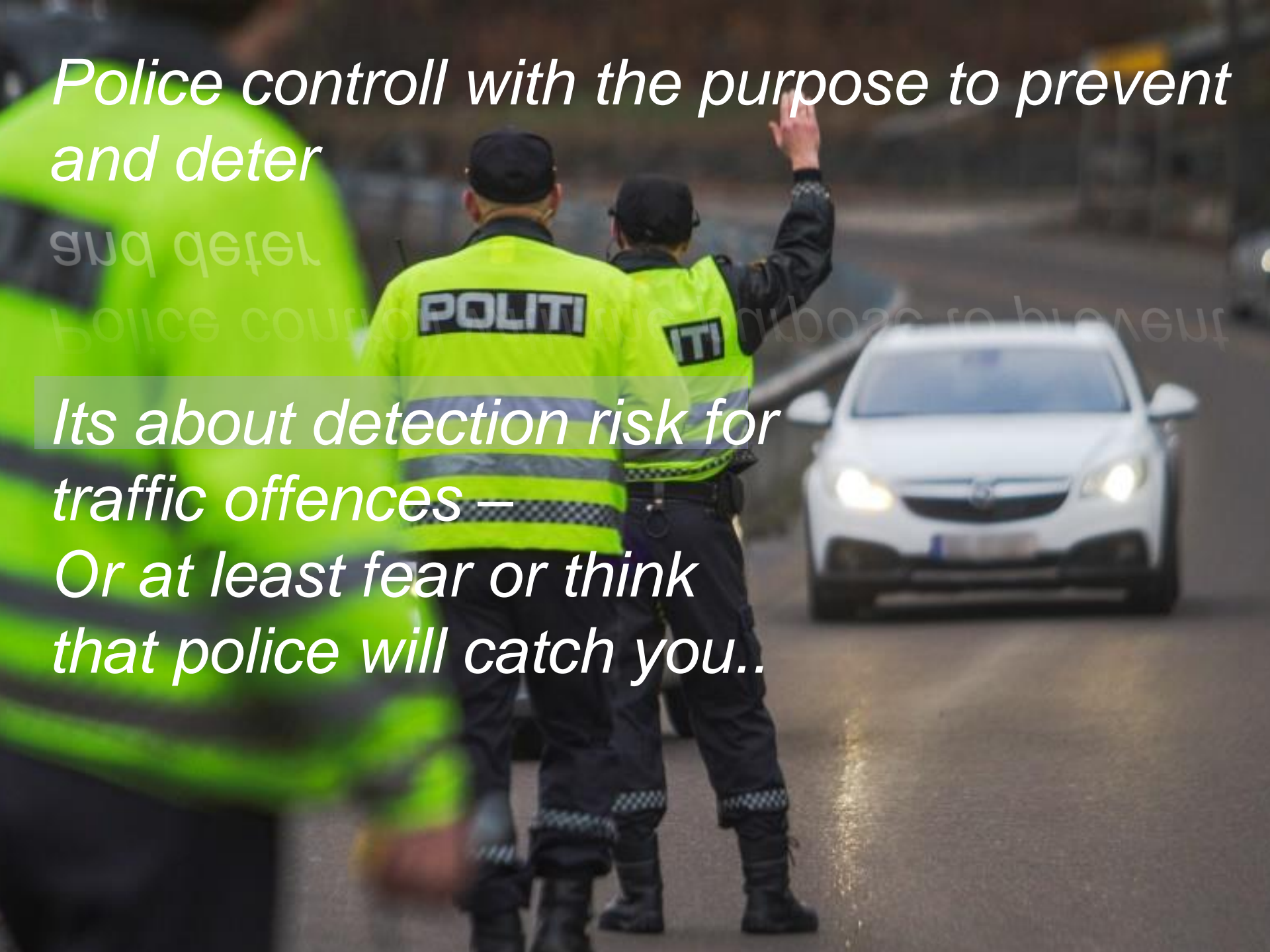
Intelligence-led policing (Road policing)

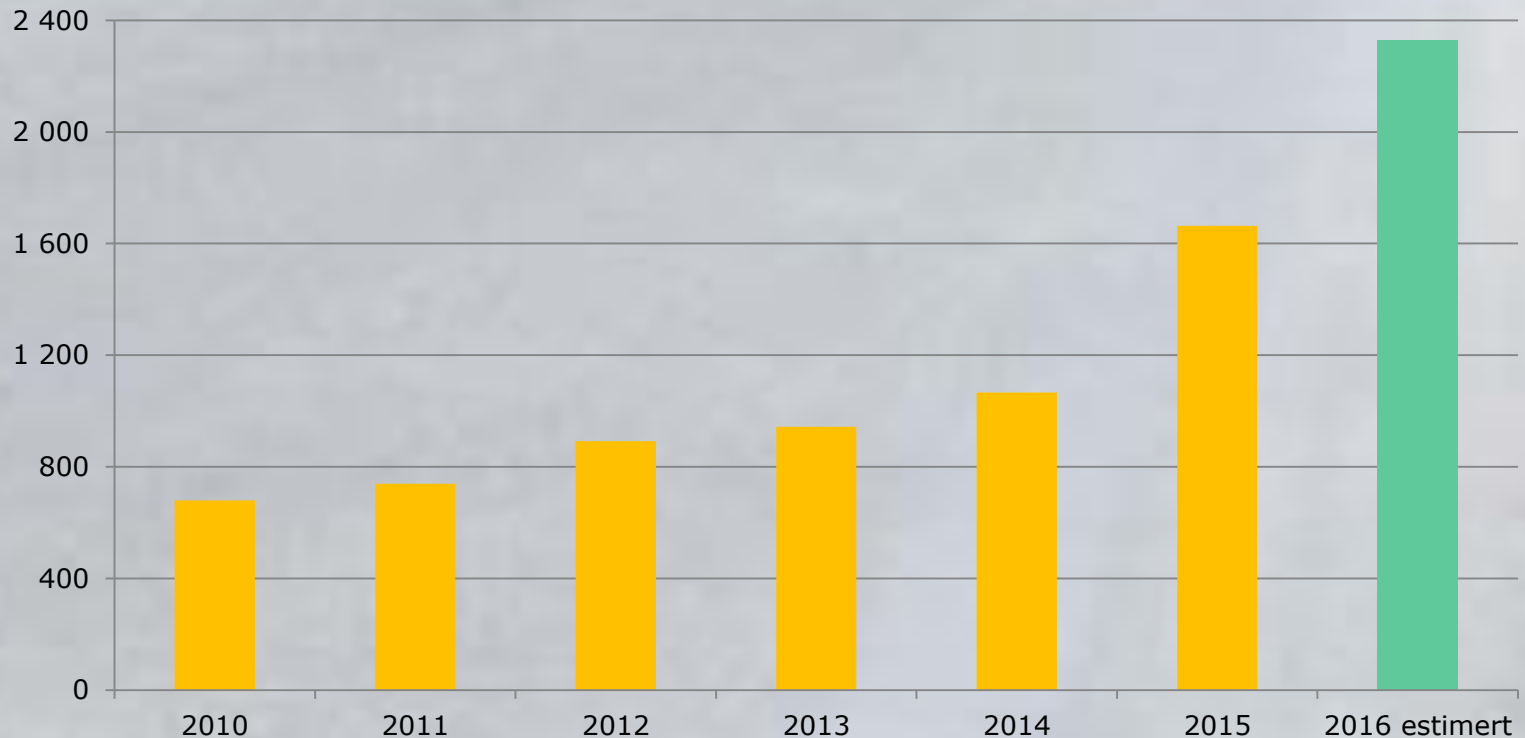
✓ *World's best traffic legislation?*
