


# First increase in road deaths since 2001





## **EU** target at stake



#### The three main road risks

Inappropriate or excessive speed

Primary factor in 1/3 of road deaths

- Driving under the influence of alcohol
- 25% of all road deaths



At least 5,600 deaths could have been prevented if all drivers involved in accidents and reported to be driving over the limit had been sober.

Failure to wear seat belts

Around 8,600 car occupants survived serious crashes in 2012 because they wore a seat belt.


## Traffic offences covered

- 1. Speeding
- 2. Drink driving
- 3. Failure to use a seat belt
- 4. Illegal use of mobile phone

#### Effectiveness of enforcement

- Regular over a long period
- Unpredictable and difficult to avoid
- ✓ Highly visible and less visible activities
- ✓ Focus on traffic offences related to severe collisions
- Locations where violations are expected
- ✓ Follow-up by an effective and appropriate sanction
- ✓ Publicity







## Seat belt wearing rates 2015




## Annual change in number of seat belt tickets 2010-2015





#### Recommendations to countries

- Increase/maintain human and financial resources for the Police to enforce traffic law
- Each time a driver is stopped: check compliance with traffic law
- Improve follow-up of non-resident offenders
- Set national enforcement plans

 Set up transparent system for the allocation of revenues generated by fines and channel revenues back to road safety work
